

There is no such Thing as "Practice" Teeth



Did you know that over 180 million U.S. children have untreated cavities? This statistic equates to about 25% of children between the ages of two and five and 50% of children of 12-15 years old.

They are not "Just" baby teeth

Primary teeth are not "Just" baby teeth (or practice teeth). Preventing destruction of the primary teeth is essential. Unrestored cavities can and frequently lead to problems affecting the developing permanent teeth. Dental Decay is four times more common than asthma and seven times more common than hay fever. Yet, dental disease is the most preventable disease affecting children today.

The role of the Primary Teeth

A child needs the primary teeth for proper chewing and eating during the period of the child's most significant growth. Their presence helps guide the permanent teeth to the correct position, allow for healthy growth of the muscles jaw bones and muscles. Additionally, the primary teeth affect speech as well as add to an attractive appearance.

While the front four teeth last until 6-7 years of age, the back teeth (cuspids and molars)will remain until age 10-13. Early care from your dentist is essential to achieve a lifetime of good dental health for your child.
