The Various Stages of a Cavity

During your regular examinations after your cleaning, Dr. Foster checks areas of your teeth. He may



recommend a sealant for areas of children's permanent back teeth to prevent a cavity. Other times he may find an actual cavity which is a hole in the tooth. Have you ever wondered what happens when you neglect his recommendations?

A sealant is a protective plastic type material that protects the deep grooves on the top surface of the chewing teeth from cavities. As long as you keep your regular scheduled appointments, the sealants are guaranteed for 3 years. To make them last longer, stay away from sticky foods and chewing gum.

A cavity forms first as a tiny white spot in the enamel–the outer layer of tooth. Because of the acidic foods we eat, the enamel takes a beating. The appearance of white spots shows that the enamel has been damaged and a cavity may be starting. This stage of a cavity is actually reversible!

During enamel decay, the tooth enamel will start breaking down causing the softer dentin to be subject to harm. Although this cavity is not reversible, it can be repaired with a simple filling.

Once decay progresses past the enamel and dentin, you may start experiencing pain because the cavity (decay) has progressed into the pulp, the living part of the tooth that houses the nerve of the tooth. Once into the nerve of the tooth, the tooth begins to die, A filling will no longer fix the tooth. If the problem still progresses beyond this point, the infection will eat through your pulp and begin to infect the tissue and nerves inside the tooth. This becomes painful to most patients. It causes a pocket of infection that will be physically visible on the outside gums or even your cheeks. At this point a root canal could still save the tooth, or you may need to have the tooth extracted to rid your body of the infection.

So, during the stages of a cavity development, there are plenty of opportunities to stop the decay as well as treat it in a simple manner. Notice the white spots that could lead to cavities, always get regular dental check ups, and follow your dentist's recommendations to catch cavities while they are still small.



Roasted
Butternut Squash
with Pecans

Ingredients

2 (11-ounce) containers peeled diced fresh butternut squash

- · Cooking spray
- · 1/4 teaspoon kosher salt
- 1/4 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- · 1 1/2 tablespoons butter, melted
- · 2 tablespoons chopped pecans, toasted
- 1 tablespoon finely chopped fresh sage

How to Make It

- 1. Preheat oven to 425°.
- 2. Arrange butternut squash in a single layer on a rimmed baking sheet; coat with cooking spray. Sprinkle evenly with salt and pepper. Bake at 425° for 15 minutes or until browned, stirring halfway through cooking.
- Place butter in a large bowl. Stir in squash, pecans, and sage; toss to combine.
