

Bacterial Growth

Toothbrushes harbor a wide range of bacteria and can be passed by sharing toothbrushes. For instance, a bacteria called Streptococcus mutans, which causes dental decay, may exist on a toothbrush. These bacteria can metabolize simple sugars into acids. It splits the sucrose in food and uses one of the sugars to build its protective capsule


(dental plaque) that sticks tightly to the tooth.

Bleeding Gums

Toothbrushes can also pass on blood-borne diseases and illnesses. For example, brushing your teeth with a toothbrush previously used by a person with bleeding gums can pass bacteria and viruses into your bloodstream through the toothbrush. And, if the person you share the toothbrush with has hepatitis B or HIV, these diseases could be passed on through the toothbrush as well. Bleeding gums are not typical, whether you've used someone else's toothbrush or not. Call our office for an appointment as soon as possible to catch and treat gum disease in its early stages.

Sugar "N Spice Nuts

1/4 cup packed brown sugar
1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon
1/4 teaspoon cayenne pepper
1 large egg white
1 cup salted cashews
1 cup pecan halves
1 cup dry roasted peanuts
1/2 cup dried cranberries

Directions:

In a small bowl, combine the brown sugar, cinnamon and cayenne; set aside. In a large bowl, whisk egg white; add nuts and cranberries. Sprinkle with sugar mixture and toss to coat. Spread in a single layer on a greased baking sheet.

Bake at 300° until golden brown, 18-20 minutes, stirring once. Cool. Store in an airtight container.
